On 4-21-17, at about 1030 hours, Detective O'nesky #824 and I responded to [REDACTED] regarding an attempted rape. Detective Esguerra #1025 contacted the victim, [REDACTED] age 15. For further information on the offense refer to Detective Esguerra's report and additional reports completed under this case number.

I observed a surveillance camera on the front of the residence at [REDACTED]. I contacted the resident [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised me the camera is not plugged in currently. She said the camera does not record, but only shows live footage when it is plugged in. [REDACTED] said she also has a camera on the back of the residence, but it is not currently plugged in either. [REDACTED] said on 4-21-17, at about 1000 hours she heard her dogs barking in the rear yard. [REDACTED] said she looked outside but did not see anything suspicious.

I responded to [REDACTED] and observed cameras on the residence. I contacted [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said the cameras record, but they only have a view of his residence and yard. [REDACTED] said he had been home but did not hear or see anything suspicious.

I responded to [REDACTED] and observed cameras on the residence. I contacted the resident [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said the cameras do not record. [REDACTED] said he did not hear or see anything suspicious.

I responded to the 3200 block of Haley Street and observed a subject standing near the front of [REDACTED]. I contacted the subject who was identified as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] spoke primarily Spanish and I was not able to ask him if he observed anything. [REDACTED] was able to provide me with a phone number in order to speak with a Spanish speaking detective.

Detective Esguerra advised me a subject may have witnessed [REDACTED] and the suspect two houses north of [REDACTED]. I responded to [REDACTED] and observed the house described was [REDACTED]. I was not able to make contact with anyone at the residence and there were no vehicles to the front of the residence or in the driveway.

I was not able to locate any video surveillance in the area or witnesses to the incident.

[REDACTED] stated it is not uncommon for transients to discard trash and property along that side of his property. The Bakersfield Police Communications Center provided a suspect description and advised he was in possession of an unknown color backpack. We seized the Black "ES" brand backpack as possible evidence, due to the location of the backpack and where the offence occurred. I took digital photographs where the backpack was located which i later downloaded to the Bakersfield Police Department DIMS for storage.

On 04/21/17, at about 1013 hours, I spoke to [REDACTED] at the Bakersfield Police Department, located at 1601 Truxtun Avenue. My interview with [REDACTED] was digitally recorded and the following is a synopsis of what I learned.

Today, at about 0735 hours, [REDACTED] left her residence [REDACTED] and she began to walk alone to a bus stop in order to go to school. [REDACTED] described walking northbound on Haley Street and on the east side of the roadway.

As she neared the southeast corner of [REDACTED] and Vanderbilt Drive, she heard the sound of another person walking behind her. [REDACTED] looked over her shoulder and observed the suspect who she described as a:

Light Complexed Black Male/5'5" to 5'6"/Early 20s/Medium Build/Green or Hazel Eyes
Moles on Left side of Face

wearing a:

Bright, Red, Hooded Sweatshirt with a front pocket and the hood over his head/Gym Shorts

walking behind her.

As [REDACTED] approached the northeast corner of [REDACTED] and Vanderbilt, she stated the suspect placed one of his arms around her neck, which she described as being in a "choke hold". [REDACTED] told me the suspect then told her that if she was "smart" she would not do "anything dumb". The subject then began to pull her eastbound onto Vanderbilt Drive.

While being pulled, [REDACTED] observed a vehicle traveling westbound on Vanderbilt Drive that stopped at the stop sign on Vanderbilt Drive and [REDACTED] described the vehicle has a:

When the vehicle came to stop, [REDACTED] yelled out for "help" and as she did the suspect applied more pressure to her neck, which caused her to have difficulties breathing. Though she yelled out for help, the subject in the black vehicle turned southbound onto Haley Street.

At one point, while being pulled by the suspect, [REDACTED] stated the suspect removed a firearm from his sweatshirt pocket and held it near her torso. As he did so, he instructed [REDACTED] to stay quiet and also asked her for money. [REDACTED] stated as the suspect was pulling her, he appeared somewhat confused as if he did not know where he was going to take her.

[REDACTED] stated the suspect eventually pulled her into an alley and to the rear of an unknown residence. As they were in the alley, [REDACTED] observed 2 adult, Hispanic, males working on a yellow truck about 5 houses away. [REDACTED] told me before the suspect pushed her into the "cut out" of the rear yard, she believes the subjects working on the vehicle observed her. [REDACTED] thought about asking the subjects for help, but based on what the suspect was doing to her she felt "vulnerable" and she did not ask for help.

Once the suspect pushed her into this "cut out", she described being out of view from the alley. There, she stated the suspect pushed her up against the wall with her face facing the wall. [REDACTED] began to cry and the suspect told her not to. As the suspect was behind her, the suspect reached around her waist and unbuttoned her shorts. The suspect then pulled her short and underwear down to her knees.

After the suspect pulled down her clothing, she felt the suspect bare penis on her buttocks. As this was occurring, she felt the suspect masturbating himself. She also observed the subject place 1 of his fingers inside her vagina, which she stated lasted for about 1 minute. [REDACTED] continued to cry and the suspect continued to tell her to be quiet. Soon after, she stated the suspect tried to place his penis inside her vagina, but for some reason the suspect had difficulties finding the "hole" to her vagina. However, she did feel the tip of the suspect's erect penis making contact with her buttocks and anus. This occurred for about 5 to 6 minutes, and she told the suspect to let her go, but he told her he would "hurt" her if she said anything.

After the suspect was not able to insert his penis inside her vagina, he stopped and asked [REDACTED] if she had any money. At this point [REDACTED] was pulling her clothes back on and she told the suspect that she only had \$3.00, but he told her that he needed at least \$10.00. [REDACTED] told him that she had more money at her residence and he again placed one of his arms around her neck, but he released his grasp a short time later at which time he instructed [REDACTED] that they would walk over to her residence to get more money.

As they walked towards her residence, which she described as the two walking side by side, the suspect told her that he did not know why he was doing what he was doing. The suspect also told her that he lived on the "streets" and played football at "[REDACTED]". [REDACTED] asked the suspect if he believed in God, which he stated he did and that he attended church on "Sundays".

When they neared her residence, the suspect asked her if anyone was inside her residence and she lied to the suspect and told him that no one was there. The suspect then removed the firearm from his person and told her he would "cause drama" if something happened.

At one point, while near [REDACTED], which is 2 residences north of [REDACTED] residence, [REDACTED] observed the father of one her friend's [REDACTED] sitting in the driver side of a black BMW. [REDACTED] stated she walked pass the vehicle and continued towards her residence, but that the suspect stayed behind.

[REDACTED] then entered her residence and she thought about locking the door, but she did not want the suspect to cause additional harm so she did not tell her mother what had happened. Instead, she took possession of \$15.00 (1 x \$5.00 and 1 x \$10.00) and she exited her residence. She then walked back to where the suspect was standing and she provided the suspect with the money. As she did, she stated [REDACTED] father was still inside the BMW.

After she provided the money to the suspect, he asked her if she was "mad", but she did not respond and she returned to her residence. As she did, she observed the suspect walk northbound. When [REDACTED] arrived to her residence, she told her mother about some of the things that had occurred at which time she and her mother exited the residence. When they did, she stated the suspect was still walking northbound, but that he was very far from their residence.

[REDACTED] stated she had never seen the suspect before, but that she would be able to identify him if seen again. She also agreed to complete a composite sketch of the suspect.

[REDACTED] was informed about obtaining a sexual assault exam, which was later performed on her person.

[REDACTED] only complained of pain to her neck area. While speaking with [REDACTED], I observed slight redness around her neck. I took photographs of [REDACTED] injuries, which I later submitted to DIMS.

[REDACTED] signed a Bakersfield Police Department Confidentiality form, which was scanned to this report and she was also provided with a Bakersfield Police Department Victim of Violent Crime pamphlet.

I know through my experience as a police officer, criminals often utilize vacant residences and structures to hide from law enforcement, or to hide evidence. I observed a few vacant residences in the neighborhood around the area the incident occurred. The residences were:

Officer A. Garcia #1183, Officer K. Knott #1188, and I attempted to locate the suspect or evidence inside the vacant residences but were met with negative results.

Officer Patino advised, the victim told him, she saw two male subjects in the alley on the west side of [REDACTED] who may have witnessed the incident. I contacted the resident of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], who told me no male subjects reside at her residence, she was not having any work done at her house, and she could not provide any information regarding the subjects on the rear side of her residence.

At this time, the identities of the two males are not yet know, but this information will be sent to the Burglary Unit so additional follow-up can be completed in an attempt to identify those depicted in the photographs.

He told me a probationer assigned to him, [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]), had informed him that over the weekend police were at his residence. During the follow-up, it was learned [REDACTED] was not exist, and contact was made with the resident of [REDACTED] but he stated he did not know [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] has another listed address at [REDACTED] but as of 04/30/17 no attempt has been made to contact him at that address. On 05/03/17, I went to [REDACTED]. He could not really recall what he did on 04/21/17, but he stated he would typically wake up at about 0900 hours and be at work at about 1000 hours. However, a couple of weeks ago he was fired from his employer. He also mentioned he had been living at the residence with his wife, but that she moved out several weeks ago and when she left she took their vehicle with her. [REDACTED] has some similar characteristics as the suspect. For example, he was 5'7", he was a light complexed black male, and he had green eyes. However, he did not have distinct moles. On 04/23/17, at about 1249 hours, I spoke to [REDACTED] at the Bakersfield Police Department, located at 1601 Truxtun Avenue. My interview with her was digitally recorded and the following is a synopsis of what was learned.

During the day of the incident, when [REDACTED] was walking to the bus stop, she stated she had removed a piece of gum from her person and was eating it. This was consistent with [REDACTED] statement about [REDACTED] seeing [REDACTED] eating an unknown item as [REDACTED] watched [REDACTED] walk by her house.

[REDACTED] also recalled telling the nurse who performed the sexual assault exam on her person that the suspect that provided her with oral sex, but not tell me. [REDACTED] was also sure about observing [REDACTED] vehicle being parked in front of [REDACTED] residence, but she was not sure whether [REDACTED] was inside the vehicle, but she also recalled the suspect looking over to [REDACTED] vehicle.

[REDACTED] also stated she observe the suspect fleeing northbound from the area and she suspects her mother was not able to see the suspect when her mother exited the residence because her mother was towards the front of the residence. In that area, she stated it is difficult for one to see over the "hill" and where she was standing, which was at a higher elevation, she was able to see the suspect walking away.

Regarding [REDACTED], [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] had been sending her photographs of possible suspect, and on 04/22/17, at about 1100 hours, [REDACTED] sent her a photograph of someone that "looked" like the suspect. There was no name attached to the photograph that [REDACTED] observed. [REDACTED] stated when she first observed the suspect, he did not have the hood of his sweatshirt over his head. line-up for a little over a minute, [REDACTED] said she did not know, but pointed at photograph number 4 and said, "this one looks like him in a way". I had [REDACTED] circle number 4 and to write down what she said, which she did. [REDACTED] stated the person depicted in photograph number 4 looked like the suspect because of his eyes and lips. However, it did not look like the suspect because the person depicted in photograph number 4 had facial hair and no moles. Though this photograph of [REDACTED] did not show his moles clearly, there are other photographs of [REDACTED] where one can see scars and moles on his face.

The photographic line-up was scanned into the report and later booked into the Bakersfield Police Department Property Room as evidence.

Later, [REDACTED] was shown the photograph of [REDACTED] from his Facebook account and she identified the photograph as the one she was shown.

[REDACTED] also told me that she recalled the suspect having a low and deep voice. She also did not believe the suspect lived on the streets because the suspect did not have a dirty appearance.





On 4/21/17 at 0945 hours, I was in the Special Victim's Unit office at the Bakersfield Police Station, when Officer PATINO briefed me and Detective ESGUERRA #1025 regarding the investigation prior to that time. Refer to Officer PATINO for further details regarding his investigation. Detective ESGUERRA requested that Detective TIPTON #1163 and I coordinate with the officers regarding canvassing the area where this occurred. At 1030 hours, Detective TIPTON and I responded to the 2900 block of [REDACTED] where we spoke with Senior Officer MOE, Officer A. GARCIA, and Officer KNOTT, who advised us of their canvass of the area. They said that Lab Technician JUANITA LEE had already come and photographed the scene. Refer to those officers' reports for further details.

Officer PATINO directed us to the east alley of [REDACTED] behind [REDACTED], which was the location that was identified as where the sexual assault occurred, which was the second house south of Vanderbilt Dr. Officer PATINO also directed us to the northeast corner of [REDACTED] and Vanderbilt Dr., on the sidewalk, as being the location where the suspect initially contacted [REDACTED]. I observed the path from that location to the rear of [REDACTED] was paved. Detective TIPTON and I later used a tape measure to determine the approximate distance from the location where the suspect contacted [REDACTED] where the sidewalk starts, to the location behind [REDACTED], where she was sexually assaulted is 240 feet. I observed the rear of the residences between those two locations have walls to the rear of them, which would limit a potential witness from seeing them in pass through that portion of the alley. I also observed there was a short driveway to the rear of [REDACTED], which was recessed from the alley and that driveway was concealed from anyone looking down the alley. I looked on that paved driveway and I could not locate any evidence that appeared to be related to this case. I photographed the area to the rear of [REDACTED] and I later downloaded those photographs into DIMS. I used the odometer of my vehicle (vehicle #5221) to determine the distance from the rear of [REDACTED], where [REDACTED] was sexually assaulted to her residence ([REDACTED]), where she said the suspect walked with her, was 0.2 miles.

I contacted [REDACTED] at [REDACTED], which is two houses south of [REDACTED] residence and [REDACTED] told me that on 4/21/17 from 0730 to 0800 hours, she and her three year old grandson were the only people who were home. She said she stayed inside of her residence and she did not notice anyone in the area.

I observed the residence at [REDACTED], which was three houses away from [REDACTED] residence had cameras to the front of it, but those cameras did not likely cover the area of [REDACTED] residence, based on the direction the cameras were pointed. That yard was fenced in with a dog in the yard, which prevented me from approaching the residence. I left my business card in the mail box and [REDACTED] said she would ask her son to ask the resident at [REDACTED] to call me. The resident from that address never called me. On

4/25/17, I made phone contact with [REDACTED] son, [REDACTED], who said he spoke with his neighbor at [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) who told him that the cameras on his residence did not work. [REDACTED] told me that this neighbor's, who he only knew as "[REDACTED]", phone number is [REDACTED]. On 4/25/17, I left a voice message on that phone number, which had a voice mail greeting for [REDACTED], but my voice message has not been returned. An RMS record check showed that [REDACTED] lives at [REDACTED].

Detective TIPTON and I canvassed the area from the 2900 block of [REDACTED] to the alley behind [REDACTED] and we were unable to locate any cameras that had not already been checked by me, Detective TIPTON, or the other officers who canvassed the area. Without telling her anything else, she told me she sees a subject who matches that description regularly in the parking lot of that [REDACTED]. She said he usually asks people for money in the parking lot and he does not enter the store. She said she saw him on 4/21/17 at about 0930 hours in the [REDACTED] parking lot, wearing a red hooded sweatshirt, but she did not know what color his shorts were. At that time, she contacted him in person and told him to leave, which he did without incident. She said the exterior [REDACTED] cameras are of poor quality and he would not have been able to have been seen on the store video, unless someone used the zoom-in camera function on him, which was not done. [REDACTED] further described that male as a





On 05/11/17, I was informed officers had detained BRANDON ROBINSON (19 years old) for a sexual abuse incident (17-103871) that occurred at [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]). Detective Wimbish told me what the victim had reported and he provided me with BRANDON ROBINSON's description. Based on what I had learned, I suspected BRANDON ROBINSON was possibly the suspect in not only this investigation, but also the suspect in case number 17-47969.

I observed a prior booking photograph of BRANDON ROBINSON and observed he matched the suspect description that was provided by [REDACTED]. He also had some similarities to the composite sketch that was completed by [REDACTED]. BRANDON ROBINSON also matched the suspect description provided by the victim, [REDACTED], in case number 17-47969.

At about 1728 hours, Detective Wimbish and I interviewed BRANDON ROBINSON at the Bakersfield Police Department, located at 1601 Truxtun Avenue. Our conversation was digitally recorded. I informed BRANDON ROBINSON we needed to speak to him about not only today's incident, but also about what had happened about a few months ago. I explained to BRANDON ROBINSON that what occurred was not an accurate representation of who he was and he agreed. This immediately led me to believe that he was in fact responsible for the other mentioned incidents.

I then advised BRANDON ROBINSON of his Miranda rights, which he stated he understood. The following is a synopsis of what was learned.

BRANDON ROBINSON resides with his sister, [REDACTED], at 1400 Calcutta Drive #76. He had been residing out of town, but returned to Bakersfield, CA earlier this year. BRANDON ROBINSON identified having some physical ailments, and he stated he did not have any mental disabilities. However, he attended counseling for things that transpired between him and his father, "[REDACTED]" ([REDACTED]). BRANDON ROBINSON denied using illegal drugs, prescription medication, and he denied consuming alcoholic beverages. Later, he acknowledged to consuming marijuana in the past. He provided his cellular telephone number as [REDACTED] and his provider as Metro PCS.

BRANDON ROBINSON identified himself as a student of [REDACTED], which he started attending this semester. On Mondays and Wednesdays, he is at school for most of the day. He arrives to school mostly by bus, but sometimes gets rides from others, and he leaves his residence around 0800 hours. During the other days of the week, BRANDON ROBINSON arrives to the college for football practice and he agreed that on Fridays he gets to the college earlier because practice starts at 0800 hours. The incident on 04/21/17 (Friday) occurred some sometime around 0830 hours.

Regarding the allegations, I showed him a photograph of [REDACTED] that was taken of her during the day of the report incident. While speaking to BRANDON ROBINSON about the allegations, he was very emotional and he acknowledged he was responsible for the assault on [REDACTED]. He attributed his acts against [REDACTED] as a result of what had happened to him in the past; not being in his "right mind"; his father's sexual addiction; and "Satan" having control of him.

Regardless, he acknowledged he and [REDACTED] talked about "God" and him attending church. Prior to the incident, he had never met [REDACTED] before. BRANDON ROBINSON provided several key facts about what occurred during the day of the incident that only the suspect and [REDACTED] would have known. That day, he stated he was walking on [REDACTED] and towards [REDACTED]. As he was walking on [REDACTED] he stated he went "behind" [REDACTED] and that he took advantage of her. BRANDON ROBINSON stated the incident occurred because he was hungry and because of his sexual issue. At one point, he would say that he did not know how old [REDACTED] was.

BRANDON ROBINSON was asked if he took [REDACTED] anywhere and he stated he took [REDACTED] into an "alley". There, he stated he touched her buttocks with his hand and that he had a fake "BB gun". He described the gun as being black. He would go on to say the following day he gave the gun to his friend who he could only identify as "I" or "[REDACTED]".

BRANDON ROBINSON stated at one point he asked [REDACTED] for money and she told him that she had \$15.00. I asked BRANDON ROBINSON how [REDACTED] clothing was pulled down and he stated it was "all" him. When he did, he described [REDACTED] facing away from him, which was consistent to the victim's statement, and that he was behind [REDACTED]. At one point, he stated he touched [REDACTED] on her vagina and that on two occasions he inserted his fingers inside her vagina, which again was consistent with the victim's statement.

BRANDON ROBINSON told us he attempted to place his penis inside [REDACTED] "butt". As this was occurring, [REDACTED] asked him if he had any sexually transmitted infections. He also recalled [REDACTED] telling him to "stop". BRANDON ROBINSON was asked why he tried to do these things to [REDACTED] and he again reverted back to not being in his right mind. Sometime later, BRANDON ROBINSON was asked how he grabbed [REDACTED] and he described putting his arm around her neck, which was consistent with the victim's statement. He was also asked if his mouth went anywhere on [REDACTED] and he stated it went on her vagina, but he stated that was not his intention and he was trying to place his mouth on her buttocks.

I asked him why he walked [REDACTED] back to her residence and he stated because he wanted to explain to [REDACTED] that he was not a bad person. Also during their walk, he stated [REDACTED] told him that she would help him and after she returned from her residence she provided him with \$15.00, which is the exact amount the victim stated she had provided to him.

I asked BRANDON ROBINSON why he threatened [REDACTED] with the BB gun and he stated because he believed doing so would be the most frightening. Regarding the BB gun, he would later tell us that he took

it from his grandmother, [REDACTED], residence sometime around Easter. He identified her address as [REDACTED]. He told us the day after the incident, he left the BB gun inside "[REDACTED]" vehicle. He described the vehicle as being a newer, black, Chevrolet. BRANDON ROBINSON also stated [REDACTED] telephone number in his cellular telephone was identified as "[REDACTED]", and that [REDACTED] lived somewhere in the area of [REDACTED] High School. He also stated [REDACTED] used to play football in Utah, but that [REDACTED] was now a player at [REDACTED]. BRANDON ROBINSON told us he did not know whether [REDACTED] still had the BB gun.

BRANDON ROBINSON would later give us permission to look into his cellular telephone.

For additional information regarding BRANDON ROBINSON's statement about the other two investigations (17-103871 and 17-47969), which at admitted to also being responsible for, refer to the reports accomplished under those case numbers.

After we spoke to BRANDON ROBINSON about 3 offenses, he told us about what happened to him when he was younger, which he stated occurred between him and his cousin when they were both between the ages of 6 and 13. He described the two as having sexual contact with one another. The sexual contact was initiated by his cousin, which he was not okay with, but after sometime went by BRANDON ROBINSON went along with the sexual contact. BRANDON ROBINSON stated his cousin was from his father's side of the family, but he never told his father about what transpired or anyone else. BRANDON ROBINSON and his cousin last had sexual contact about a year ago. He also told me he did not believe his cousin should get in trouble for what transpired between the two.

BRANDON ROBINSON also consented to a buccal swab, which was later obtained by Detective Wimbish and booked by Detective Wimbish into the Bakersfield Police Department Property Room as evidence.

For further information regarding BRANDON ROBINSON's interview, refer to video and recording, which was submitted to DIMS.

Additionally, at one point during our interview, Detective Wimbish and I exited the room. When we did exit, I left my binder that contained my digital recorded. After we exited, BRANDON ROBINSON was observed taking my recorded out of the binder and deleted the contents within the recorded, which was observed through the video recording. When we ended our interview with BRANDON ROBINSON, I asked him why he deleted the contents and he stated because he was "scared". He followed up by saying that he was aware the "cops" were trying to get everything out of him.

On 05/11/17, I authored a search warrant to search BRANDON ROBINSON's residence (1400 Calcutta Drive #76), which was later granted by Judge J. Brownlee. For additional information regarding the search warrant, refer to the attached document.

At about 2150 hours, officers responded to the residence and executed the search warrant. Upon doing so, contact was made with both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Prior to searching the residence, digital photographs of the residence were taken.

While speaking with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Detective Abshire, along with other officers searched the residence. My conversations with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], which were done separately, were digitally recorded. The following is a synopsis of what was learned.

As I started to speak to [REDACTED], she identified BRANDON ROBINSON as sleeping on the living room couch. [REDACTED] had some knowledge that something had happened with BRANDON ROBINSON, but she did not have any real facts. I briefly told her about the investigation and why we were at the residence at which time I provided her with a copy of the search warrant.

[REDACTED] stated she moved into the residence sometime around 03/11/17, and BRANDON ROBINSON began live with her off and on around April. She described the residence as being one bedroom and that BRANDON ROBINSON's belongings could be located in the living room. She was not sure whether she had ever observed BRANDON ROBINSON wear a red sweater and she has never observed him wear any blue shorts. She has also never seen BRANDON ROBINSON in possession of a pellet gun and BRANDON ROBINSON never disclosed to her about any sexual abuse incidents.

[REDACTED] also told me that BRANDON ROBINSON started "[REDACTED]" this semester. As I started to ask her about the days BRANDON ROBINSON attended class, she became hesitant in answering my question. Ultimately, she stated she would speak to me at a later time, which I told her was okay. She was provided my contact information to contact me when she wished.

[REDACTED] was also briefly told about the investigation and why officers were at her residence. She told me she has been living at the residence since 03/06/17. The sweater was seized by Detective Abshire and later booked into the Bakersfield Police Department Property as evidence. No other items were located.

is probable cause to believe, and Affiant does believe, that the designated articles, property, and persons are now in the described locations, including all rooms, buildings, and structures used in connection with the premises and buildings adjoining them, the vehicles and the persons.

For the past 2 ½ years I have been assigned to the Bakersfield Police Department Investigations Division. Prior to this, I was assigned to the Patrol Division for nine years. I attended the Basic California POST Academy, which provided me with instruction regarding investigations involving acts of violence. I have investigated and testified in court involving crimes such as homicides, assaults with deadly weapon, assaults that resulted in great bodily injury, child abuse, domestic violence, rapes, and child molestations. During these investigations, and arrests of persons involved in these types of criminal activity I have seized several items used in the commission of these crimes, which include, but are not limited to weapons, burglary tools, false identification cards, as well as items of evidence left at the scenes, which include, but is not limited to DNA and latent prints.

On almost a daily basis, I consult with other detectives of the Special Victim's Unit to discuss current methods and techniques of investigating such offenses.

I state the following facts will establish grounds for the issuance of a search warrant and will further establish probable cause for believing that said grounds exist.

On 04/21/17, a 15 year old female victim reported a suspect, who was later identified as Brandon Robinson (19 years old), put his arm around her neck and pulled from the roadway into an alley. There, the suspect pulled down her shorts and underwear. After doing so, the suspect sexually assaulted her. This included the suspect placing his finger inside her vagina; he tried to place his penis in both her vagina and anus; and he placed his mouth on her vagina, which was all done against her will. During this incident, there was a point when the suspect banished a black, semi-auto, firearm at the victim. When the incident occurred, the victim stated the suspect was wearing:

wearing a:

Bright, Red, Hooded Sweatshirt with a front pocket and the hood over his head/Gym Shorts

A witness on 04/21/17, stated they believed the suspect's shorts were blue.

Today, 05/11/17, a different victim reported a similar incident that involved Robinson. Under Miranda, Robinson was questioned about the incident on 04/21/17, and he admitted to the offense involving the juvenile. However, he stated the firearm he used was actually a pellet gun and a friend of his was now in possession of the pellet gun. While speaking with Robinson, he identified his address as:

1400 Calcutta Drive #76, Bakersfield, CA 93304

Robinson was almost certain he did not own a red sweatshirt, but that he did own red clothing. Robison was not able to provide enough information for his friend who allegedly now possessed the pellet gun therefore, we were not able to confirm if in fact the friend now possessed the pellet gun. As result, it is still very possible that the pellet gun and the clothing Robison wore during the offense on 04/21/17 could be located inside his residence.

The purpose of my visit was to show [REDACTED] a photographic line-up of BRANDON ROBINSON, which depicted him in the number 3 position. Our conversation was digitally recorded and the following is a synopsis of what was learned.

Prior to showing [REDACTED] the line-up, I admonished her about the line-up and she stated she understood. After the admonishment, we spoke about the 2 prior line-ups and she stated she understood what she was supposed to do. Upon showing her the line-up, she identified BRANDON ROBINSON as the person responsible for the incident by saying "that one" as she pointed to the number 3. I then had [REDACTED] to circle and initial the person who she had selected. [REDACTED] also signed the line-up, which I later seized and booked into the Bakersfield Police Department. A copy of the line-up was also scanned to this report.

When then discussed the 2nd line-up she had been shown and asked her if she recalled the person who she had selected then, which she stated she did. I asked her if that was the same person she selected today and she stated it was not. I asked her which person was responsible for the assault and she stated the person she selected today. She based her decision on BRANDON ROBINSON's facial features and she was 90% sure the person she selected today was the person responsible for the assault. I asked her if it was possible the person she selected the last time was the suspect in the incident at which time she pointed at the BRANDON ROBINSON's photograph and said, "I think it is this one".




